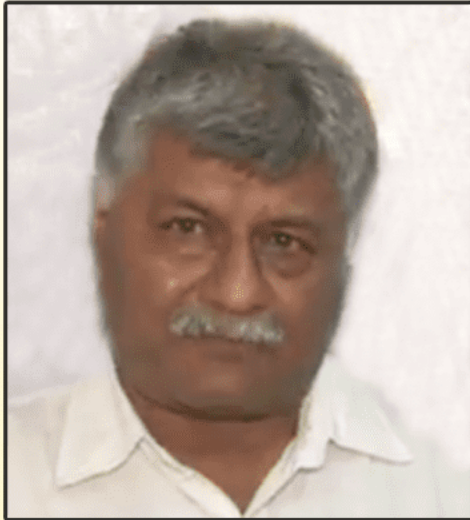

I am Chairperson, Ethics Committee, Sudha Rastogi Dental College, Faridabad (Haryana), Member, Ethic Committee, National Institute of Mentally Handicapped, Hyderabad (Telanagana), Member, Ethic Committee, Padmashree D.Y. Patil University, Pune

(Maharashtra). I was awarded my masters' and doctorate degree by Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. My thesis was on "Perceived

ENTREPRENEUR TRAINING FOR WOMEN

**TRAINING IN HANDICRAFTS :** A training in handicrafts was organised by HCF in association with Handicrafts Development Council in Moradabad. There were 20 artisans in this programme who were to be assisted for setting up of cottage manufacturing handicrafts unit. Handicrafts training is carried out at regular basis in Kolkata.

**AWARENESS CAMPS :** Awareness camps for young women candidates were organised in Ambala in the

state of Haryana. Whereby women students of the year graduation were given entrepreneurship training and guidance was provided to help and encourage them set up self employment activities. Senior officers of industries department guided the participants.

**ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME AT DEHRADUN :** The entrepreneurship development programme was organised at Dehradun Uttarakhand during September-October 2008.

A total of 50 candidates participated in the programme including both men and women. The programme was organized in association with council for small Industries Uttarakhand and District Industries Centres. Services of officers of SISI were also availed.
